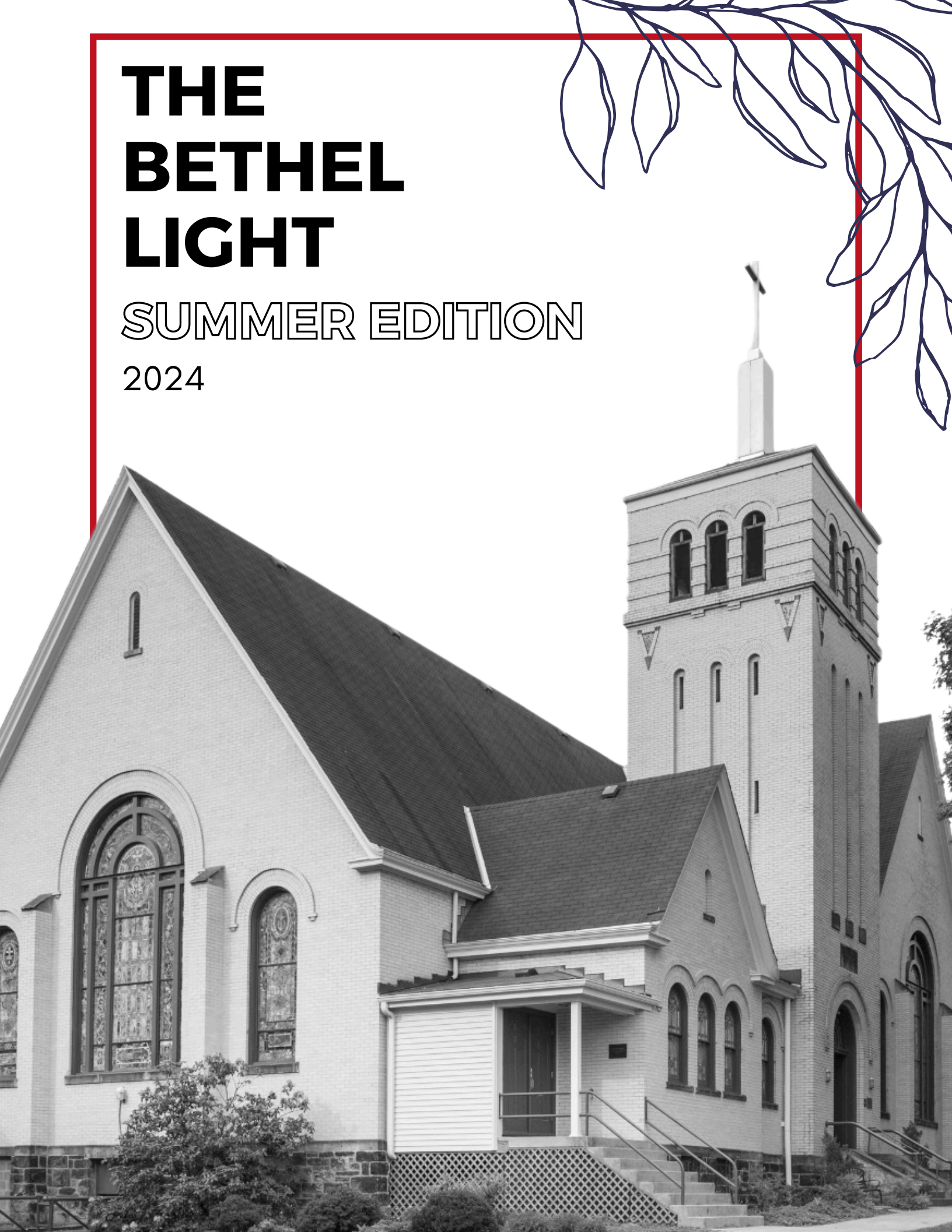

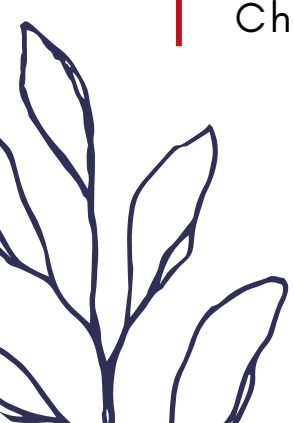

LETTER FROM PASTOR CATHIE

Dear ones,

I'm so excited about how plans for the summer at BPC are coming together. 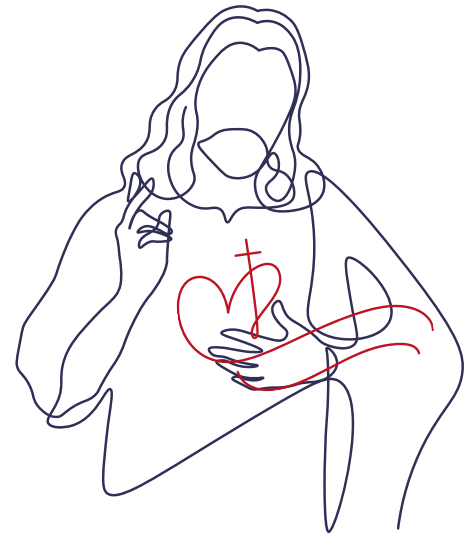

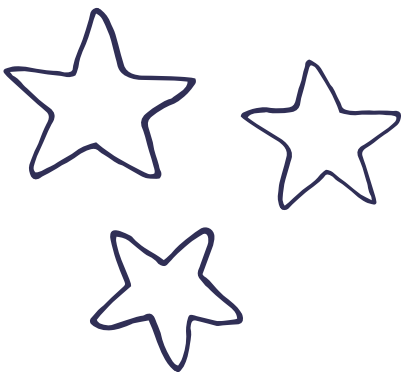

We are heading into summer, and it has been a few months since we all grabbed our 2024-star words. I was wondering how you are doing with the word you received. Any new revelations come to the surface? This year when the stars words came out, my first word was strength. Well, that is no surprise, no challenge there I get tired of being strong all the time, so I picked another one (guilty as charged)! The word is Serenity ... Now we are getting somewhere!



The halls in the church will be a little quieter during the week now that the Preschool is done for the summer. The windows are open, and the smell of fresh cut grass and the sweet sound of the birds is in the air.

Growing up there were 7 kids, a couple of parents, a grandma, an uncle, and an aunt with two kids. There was noise in ample jubilation! We would eat together, play together, sit together and there was never a single moment of quiet. I remember moving out of the house at the tender age of 17.... The first evening was so quiet I was quite frightened to be honest. I could hear my heart beat in my ears..... I thought - ugh I don't like this as my heart pounded louder. Then as the years ebbed and flowed, I started to have little moments of quiet. I started to relish those moments of quiet. Believe it or not, I actually went on a silent retreat a few years ago and it

was unnerving. I didn't really get the concept yet, and I see now the opportunity I missed. There is something about quiet that is so inviting. The quiet of sitting on your porch listening to the trees move with the wind, the birds chirping, and trying to distinguish between the tree frogs and crickets. It reminds me of Contemplative Prayer.

I would describe contemplative prayer as a way of being present with God but letting Him do the talking! No spoken words and finding a word that will bring you back when your mind wanders to your grocery list or the mechanics of your car. Have you ever tried it? You sit quiet and, without speaking to God, you let him speak to you. Summertime is a good time to try this if you haven't ever done it. If you are interested in this type of prayer, if you are intrigued about how anything gets accomplished during quiet unspoken words with God, I would be happy to assist you further with your exploration of contemplative prayer! 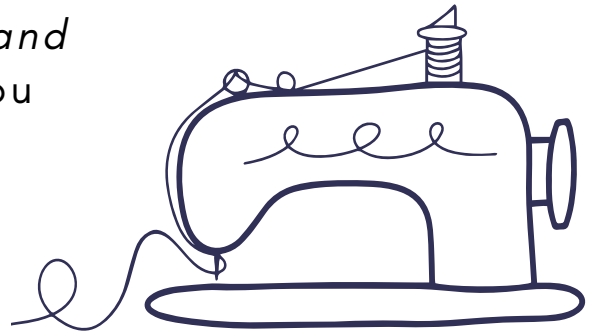

Collection for the Life Recovery Bibles will continue throughout the Summer.

Our Mission Partner - Agape Heart International has a program for residents in a refugee camp in Uganda to learn skills to become employed as a tailor/seamstress. Our current mission project with Agape Heart International is to help purchase as many sewing machines as possible to support the training and launching of students in this program. Each sewing machine costs \$200 and all donations will go to this mission.

With our Spring donations, we were able to ship 8 sewing machines and fabric to the refugee camp. If you would like to contribute to this effort, please make your checks payable to Bethel Presbyterian Church and note "Agape" on the memo line.

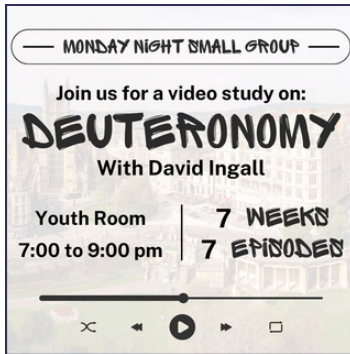

Church directory: We have worked hard with church staff to update our church directory, so please be on the lookout for an updated directory.

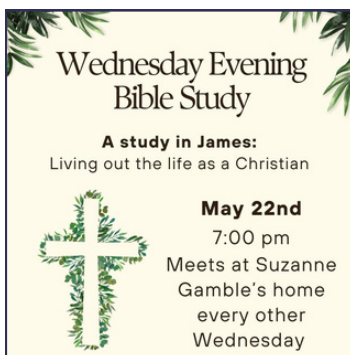

Wednesday Morning Bible Class continues with Exodus from 10-11am. Jump in anytime, we always welcome smiling faces.



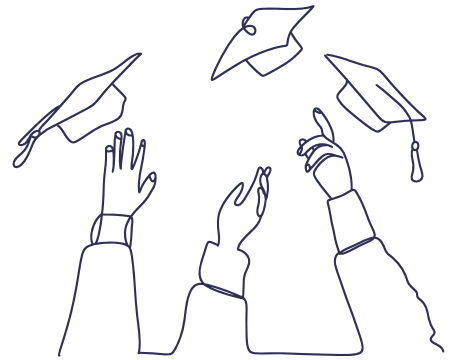
Wednesday Evening Small Group meets offsite at Suzanne Gamble's home every other Wednesday from 7-9pm and is studying James.

- Morning and Afternoon T-Class on Mondays-Thursday from 12:30-3pm

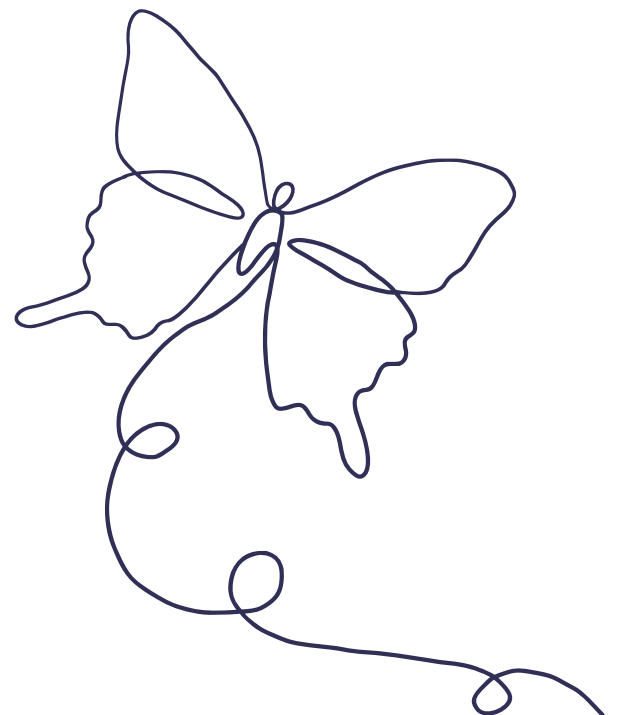

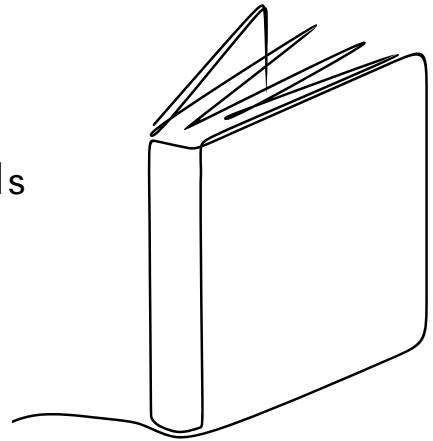

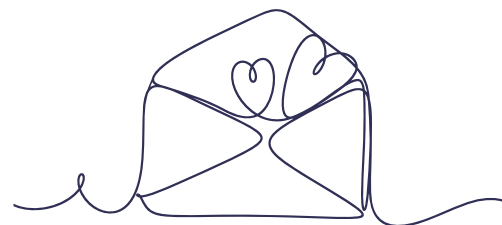
